The dog you have selected we feel will be one of these more challenging pets. As part of the adoption process for this pet please write a letter describing specific knowledge of, but not limited to, the following:

- Lifestyle (i.e. student, working person, roommates or family members available to help, sedentary or active lifestyle, etc) of the potential owner and how much time will be devoted to the needs of the dog.
- Give us a description of what you expect the "day in the life of your dog" to be.
- Basic dog care such as feeding and vaccination schedules.
- We support crate training, clarify how it works and how you will use it.
- Specifically describe your pet exercise and mental stimulation plans.
