AgHS Pets Find Happy Endings






Meet Jaelen Good!

DR. BETSY JETER

goes above
and beyond



Aggieland Humane Society relies on many community members to support daily operations of the shelter. One of those community members is Dr. Betsy Jeter. Dr. Jeter graduated from Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine and spent several decades working in local veterinary practices before transitioning into her more recent roles as a board member, volunteer, and foster for Aggieland Humane Society.

Dr. Jeter also serves as a Lecturer in Veterinary Pathobiology for the vet student teaching partnership between Aggieland Humane Society and the Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine. This program allows fourth-year veterinary students to get hands-on experience in shelter medicine by spending two weeks tending to the medical needs of the pets at Aggieland Humane. She enjoys being on hand for these students and getting to watch them interact with the shelter pets.

When Jeter isn't educating vet students or helping oversee shelter medical care, she contributes to the shelter by issuing health certificates for all pets transferred to other shelters nationwide. A health certificate authenticates the traveling pet is healthy and has all the appropriate vaccinations required by the laws of other states.

Over the years Jeter has seen numerous changes to the sheltering model and is proud of

Aggieland Humane's drive to become a no-kill community and lower euthanasia rates. While she says there are still mountains to climb, Aggieland Humane Society has made impressive strides.

She is also proud of the success of the Spay/Neuter department over the last two years. From launching the Spay/Neuter Unit to performing over 5,000 surgeries in less than two years, Jeter is happy to see Aggieland Humane provide such a needed service to the community.



When asked what she enjoys the most, Dr. Jeter mentioned having the opportunity to know the thousands of pets that move through the shelter and being able to introduce countless veterinary students to the field of shelter medicine.

Over age 70 ½?

YOU can give hope to pets in need and save on your taxes!

If you're an IRA owner who's at least age 70 ½ and must take a required minimum distribution (RMD) during 2019, please consider donating a portion or all of your distribution to care for pets in need at Aggieland Humane Society.

Under the qualified charitable distribution (QCD) rule, you can have part or all of your distribution made directly from your IRA to Aggieland Humane at any time through Dec. 31. Employer sponsored retirement plan distributions are not eligible for QCDs.

Here are four reasons to consider a QCD for your charitable contributions:

1. You never pay taxes on the amount contributed, and you don't have to itemize the deduction on your tax return. Include the QCD amount in the total IRA distributions on your Form 1040 to reflect the distribution reported to the IRS by your IRA trustee. However, the QCD amount is not included in the taxable amount reported. If you use a tax preparer, be sure to let them know you have made a QCD during the year.
2. The distribution isn't included in your adjusted gross income (AGI), which may lower the taxable amount of your Social Security benefits and/or the amount you pay for Medicare premiums.
3. It can help minimize your taxable estate while fulfilling your philanthropic wishes.
4. While your required minimum distribution may be smaller, you can contribute up to \$100,000 to charity through a QCD, total of \$200,000 for married couples.



The QCD contributions must be made to a 501(c)(3) charity, such as Aggieland Humane, or to a 170(b)(1)(a) organization (public 50%) foundation. Donor-advised funds and most private foundations are excluded. If you have a passion for animals and have RMD funds you'd like to donate, the QCD is a

great way to help pets who can't help themselves and reduce your tax bill at the same time. Please consult your tax advisor for guidance on your personal situation.
